

Conditions Treated With Chinese Medicine

According to the World Health Organization, acupuncture and other modalities of Chinese Medicine can effectively treat a wide array of acute and chronic health conditions and provide preventative care. In 1997 the U.S. National Institutes of Health concluded: "...there is sufficient evidence of acupuncture's value to expand its use into conventional medicine and to encourage further studies of its physiology and clinical value" (JAMA 280:1518-24). The following disorders may benefit from treatment:

Musculoskeletal

Arthritis, back and neck pain, bursitis, fibromyalgia, joint pain, osteoarthritis, sciatica, shoulder pain, sports injuries, sprains, TMJ, tendonitis

Gastrointestinal

Anorexia, food allergies, peptic ulcer, constipation, colitis, Crohn's disease, diarrhea, gastritis, irritable bowel syndrome, nausea, vomiting

Urogenital/Reproductive

Endometriosis, infertility, menstrual problems, menopause, morning sickness, pre-menstrual syndrome, prostate problems, sexual dysfunctions, urinary tract infection, vaginitis

Respiratory/Ear, Nose, Throat

Allergies, asthma, bronchitis, common colds, emphysema, eye diseases, flu, hearing loss, vertigo, sore throat, laryngitis, sinusitis

Eye Diseases

Macular degeneration, retinitis pigmentosa, optic atrophy, night blindness, optic neuritis & papilledema, open & closed-angle glaucoma, watering eyes, cataract, nearsightedness (myopia) in children and teenagers, conjunctivitis, welder's eye, hay fever, corneal ulcer, opacity and erosion, pinguecula, blepharitis, crossed eyes

Mental/Neurologic

Anxiety, depression, insomnia, stress, Bell's palsy, dizziness, headaches, migraines, multiple sclerosis, neuralgia, stroke, paralysis, tremors

Dermatological

Acne, dermatitis, eczema, herpes, hives, psoriasis, poison ivy, Recluse Spider bite, dog bite, snake bite.

Cardiovascular

Angina pectoris, atherosclerosis, anemia, hypertension, palpitations, coronary heart disease

Miscellaneous Disorders

Chronic pain, diabetes, fatigue, hemorrhoids, hypoglycemia, hepatitis, HIV and AIDS– related conditions, weight control, facial rejuvenation, Fertility.

Safety
